

# Les Sons Pratique 1

## in

**Explanation:** In French, sometimes 2 letters make ONE sound. In English, t and h make th together. Last week, we learned our first 2 letter combination. It is a nasal sound that doesn't exist in English. Your child knows this sound but, needs nightly practice reading it. Thank you for your help.

**in** = sound like the beginning of "ain't" without the "n" or the "t" sounds. It is in "lapin" (rabbit).

**Directions: \*\*\*\*1 minute timed\*\*\*\***

Have your child track (touch each "word"/sound) as he/she says it. If needed, your child may say "f" "in" and blend "fin". The end goal is that your child will simply say the blended word immediately (ie. "fin") without having to sound out each part.
